Follow guidelines on pg. 3, Section E, "Work from a service," in the Pinkerton Academy *Guide to Preparing the Research Paper*.

When citing online sources or electronic publications, you need to be able to guide your reader back to the place where you originally found your information. This will involve listing all or some of the following data, usually in the following order:

Last name, First name of author. "Title of article." *Original source of article*, date of publication: page numbers. Database. (Retrieved at) Place, Town/city, State. Day Month Year of retrieval. <Electronic Address or URL of the source>.

Often, all those pieces of information are not included in online database articles. In that case, note only the available information. For example, if an article has no author, begin the citation with the title of the article. Also, if there is no date listed for an article, note only the date of retrieval which is the date on which you found and read the article online.

"Title of article." *Original source of article*, date of publication: page numbers. Database. (Retrieved at) Place, Town/city, State. Day Month Year of retrieval <Electronic Address or URL of the source>.

If you still have questions about citing articles from database resources, you can usually obtain additional bibliography examples by using the "how to cite" links on the programs' initial search pages.

Citing Internet Sources

To see how to document specific types of Web sources, refer to the examples throughout this section taken from: *The MLA Handbook for Writers of Research Papers*, by Joseph Gibaldi. New York: Modern Language Assn., 2003. In some cases it may be impossible to determine the title, paging, or author of a web site. Make sure the web page is valid; then cite as much information as possible, always including the URL.

- **Book**

An online book may be the electronic text of part or all of a printed book, or a book-length document available Only on the Internet (e.g., a work of hyperfiction).

- **Citing Internet Images**



Structure:

Artist or Creator. "Description or Title of Image." Date the image was created. Online Image. *Database Name or Title of the Site*. Date of download. <URL>.
