Unified Basketball:

On Wednesday the Astros took on the Lancers at home. Despite trailing by 20 points going into the 4th quarter, the Astros put up 28 in the final frame to close the gap before losing by 2, 54 – 52. Jon White had 4 points, Adam LaPerriere had 2, Brandon Rugg added 20 points, Tyler Brand had 14 points including two threes in the final minute to close the gap, Keesha Myette added 6 points, and Jess Farnun had 6 points.

Bowling:

On Saturday the bowling team hosted Keene and Souhegan. Individual standard scores for Varsity in game 1 were: Alex Hadik 159, Andy Stock 136, Raina Stobbs 173, Theresa Lemieux 204, Jonathan Pierson 135 for a team total of 807. Game 2 scores were: Andy 194, Alex 169, Raina 170, Theresa 178 and Nick Stilian 246 for a total of 957. Overall total of 1764 put Varsity as #1 seed which earned the team a buy in the Baker round.

#2 seed Souhegan played #3 seed Keene, Souhegan won in 3 games. Souhegan 164 to Keene 154, Keene 125 to Souhegan 109. Souhegan came back with a 153 to 108 in game 3. Souhegan went on to face Pinkerton. Again a 3 game match. Souhegan scored 178 to Pinkerton's 174 in game 1, Pinkerton came back with a fantastic score of 194 to Souhegan's 155. Pinkerton then took game 3 with an outstanding 209 game to their 127. There were only 2 open frames in game 2 and 1 open in game 3, which

was a split. Andy, Alex, Raina, Theresa, Jonathan and Nick bowled the Baker games. Great bowling by all. Nick stepped up to the role of anchor bowler, marked in all 6 frames of the 3 games, picking up a split in the 10th frame of the 1st game to fill the strike.

Individual standard scores for JV in game 1 were: Alexandria Albano 112, Justin Trammell 164, Michael Komisarek 108, Ben Campbell 157, Primo Lombardi 167 for a team total of 708. Game 2 scores were Jonathan Pierson 159, Justin 122, Alexandria 140, Ben 139, Primo 144 for a total of 704. JV was #2 seed with a combined total of 1412. Rachel Lanza rolled an 86 and Michael Komisarek 135 as extra bowlers.

Pinkerton JV faced #3 seed Keene in the Baker match of 3 games. Keene took game 1 by 135 to our 125; Pinkerton took game 2 with a 127 to their 92. We lost the 3rd game 132 to Keene's 159.

Boys Indoor Track:

The Pinkerton boys track team traveled up to the University of Southern Maine for the last meet before D1s. The Astros were nothing short of fantastic with runners in many events greatly improving their times and positioning the Astros as potential favorites to win D1s next weekend.

Emmitt Smith and Chris DeCarlo went 1-2 in the 55 meter dash to get the team off to a speedy start. Kevin Davies added another foot to his personal best to win the shot put and move up several places in the state standings. Not to be outdone, the distance team went 1-2 in the 1000 led by Chris Poggi and Grant Langevin. Connor Kwiecien smashed his own sophomore record in the 600 by almost 3 seconds to take 2nd in the 600. Pinkerton took 2-4 in the 300 with some monster times led by Chip Sullivan, Chris Decarlo and

Emmitt Smith. Tony Anzivino won the boys 1500 to wrap up the day.

The state meet is 7 days away and the boys will go in riding a wave of momentum and will hopefully come away with their first indoor title in almost 2 decades.

Girls Indoor Track:

The Lady Astros could not have asked for a better way to wrap up the 2011-12 regular season. Several girls had personal records on the day. Kailee Kwiecien ran a calculated race in the 600m with a PR of 1:43.6. Abbey Smith did her part, tying her personal best in the hurdles and qualifying in the long jump with a distance of 15'11". Sammy Goldsmith ran her best race to date in the 1500m, clocking in at 5:09.5. The best individual race, however, was run by Maggie Barrie in the 300m. She shattered a 30 year old record (42.6 by Sherri Hughes in 1982 and Bree Robinson in 2007) by running a time of 41.9. Both relay teams had fantastic races as well, running best times for the season. The 4 x 400m team ran a season best 4:18.3 and the 4 x 200 m followed it up with their own season best of 1:53.9.

Ice Hockey:

The Astros completed the season sweep of Londonderry with a tough 4-3 win at Cyclones Arena on Wednesday night. The game went back and forth with many lead changes until Zach Sanford put the Astros up for good mid-way through the 3rd period.

Wrestling:

On Wednesday the varsity team traveled to Nashua to take on Bishop Guertin and came away with the 54 – 24 win. Winning for the Astros were Brenden Sullivan (pin), Branden Clark, Zack Daigle (pin), Tanner Burke, Tony Messina (pin), Hunter Morris (pin), Moise William (pin) and Jean-luc Lemieux and Tyler Wilson picked up forfeits at their weights. The Astro wrestlers are now 9-3 in dual meet competition and face Londonderry on Thursday, Feb 2nd at 7:00!

On Saturday, January 28, the Astros were among 17 teams from New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Maine and Rhode Island competing for individual and team recognition at Concord High School's Capital City Classic. The Astros scored 150 points and finished fourth in the event behind Bishop Hendicken of RI (242.5), Cumberland, RI (209) and Noble of Maine (154). Senior tri-captain Zach Daigle and freshman Jean Luc Lemieux turned in gold medal performances. Senior tri-captain Tim Parrott brought home a silver medal. Senior Tanner Burke and junior tri-captain Tony Messina won bronze medals while sophomore team mate Hunter Morris registered a sixth place finish.

Girls Basketball:

The freshman team traveled to Londonderry on Monday night to take on the Lancers. Jumping out to a quick lead, 11 – 4 after the first quarter saw the Astros on their way to the 45- 14 win. Jaime Caron played good defense and Colby Millsaps lead the team with 9 points and several offensive rebounds.

On Tuesday the varsity and j. v. teams hosted Spaulding. The varsity team jumped out to a quick 22 – 6 lead after the first quarter on their way to a 66 – 32 victory. Maggie Barrie Sophomore Indoor Track:

Maggie shattered a 30 year old record on Sunday at the meet at Southern Maine University. In the 300 meter race, she ran a time of 41.9 seconds which bested the record of 42.6 set in 1983 by Sherri Hughes and matched in 2007 by Bree Robinson.

Zach Sanford Junior Ice Hockey:
